Trial Site & Information

The show site is outdoors on packed dirt. Please bring your own crate, clean up supplies, & water for your dog.

All dogs must be on leash at all times, except when in the ring. Exercise and toilet your dog in the designated areas. Please poop and scoop and use garbage containers on the site. Please be courteous to others using the area. No aggressive dogs.

A warm-up jump will be provided for all exhibitors.

Trial Site Rules

Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning up after their dog(s). Any exhibitor failing to do so may be excused without benefit of refund if the Trial Committee deems the exhibitor to be in violation of this requirement.

There is NO SMOKING both inside of the covered arena or within 150' of the course.

Helpers

We can't do it without volunteers!!!! Please come prepared to work. We will have drinks for volunteers, and there will be a worker raffle too! A link to the on-line sign-up will be sent out with your final confirmation.

Equipment

Plastic jumps, ascending spread jump, broad jump, saloon-style tire, and rubberized contacts will be used.

Bitches in Season

May run at this trial. To be able to run a BIS, you must immediately tell the trial secretary, who will mark BIS on the running orders. The BIS will remain in their running order. If the dog is not wearing BIS pants, they will start on a mat provided by the handler. It is the handler's responsibility to ensure the mat is available for their runs. The handler/owner acknowledges the inherent risk of running a dog on an agility course with BIS pants on and assumes all risk by doing so, and the potential risks with slips from starting from a mat.

NOTE: Any BIS will run at the end of the class, regardless of height.

Directions to the Trial Site:

For the best directions from your location to the trial site, please use your GPS. These directions are provided as a backup in the event of technological issues.

From Atlanta/South of Gainesville: Take I-85 N to exit 113/ I-985 N. Once on 985, take exit 20 - GA-60 S. Turn right at the end of the ramp onto Candler Road, then right on Calvary Church Road. The arena will be 1.9 miles on your left. Make sure you're turning at the Chicopee Woods Agricultural Center entrance!!

From North of Gainesville: Take I-85 S to GA-11 N/US-129 N in Jefferson. Take exit 137 from I-85 S. Continue on GA-11 N/US-129 N. Take GA-60 N and turn left onto Calvary Church Rd. The arena will be 1.9 miles on your left. Make sure you're turning at the Chicopee Woods Agricultural Center entrance!!

Camping/RV

There are 51 RV spots (water and electric) available, \$40 per night. 25 sites have 30 AMP hook-ups and 26 have 50 AMP. There is no dump station on site, but there are shower facilities by the arena. There is also dry camping available in the stalls at a cost of \$20/night

1. Assumption of Risk & Liability

The exhibitor/owner certifies that any and all dogs brought to the facility, whether participating or not, do not pose a hazard to persons, dogs, or property. The exhibitor/owner assumes full responsibility, liability, and any resulting expenses for any damages caused by their dog(s). UK Agility International (UKI), UK Agility Ltd, their agents, officers, associates and members shall not be held liable for any loss, injury, damage, claims, demands, or liabilities involving your dog, yourself, or any third-party equipment. You agree to indemnify and hold harmless UKI and its representatives (including the club/group/ trial organizers, show management) from any claims, including legal fees, arising from injury or damages caused during participation in any event or training.

2. Hazards & Safety

The exhibitor/owner acknowledges all potential hazards associated with the training facility, event, and premises, including but not limited to: The condition of the grounds; Lighting and security measures (or lack thereof); Electrical appliances and fittings; Parking areas and fencing; The potential for a dog to escape from the training or competition area; The presence of unfamiliar animals and people; The presence of other dogs; Agility equipment; Course design and course set up; The possibility of another ill animal or your own getting ill. The exhibitor and owner assume the risk of any harm arising from and all of these including allowing their dogs to run wearing collars, stop pad protectors, bitch in season pants, or any similar items. By entering, you voluntarily assume any and all risks associated with these hazards and any other potential hazards not listed. All participants must exercise caution, monitor their dogs, and clean up after themselves and their animals.

3. Conduct & Enforcement

UK Agility International reserves the right to:

- **Excuse any participant** for what it deems excessive harshness toward a dog and for behavior considered aggressive or abusive toward another person or dog.
- **Revoke, suspend, or ban** any entry or membership at its sole discretion if deemed necessary to protect the interests of UK Agility and any of its associates, agents, officers, or members.

Participation in UKI events, including membership, is a **privilege, not a right**. UK Agility International has full authority to impose suspensions or bans without prior notice.

4. Rules & Regulations

Measuring Dogs

Please ensure you understand the new criteria regarding dogs being measured. [UKI Rule Book edition 10](#)

If a dog is under 3 and newly registered, a temporary measure or proof of the dog's height must be done by the dog's 3rd trial. A permanent measure must be obtained by a UKI official measurer between 12-18 months after the dog's first/ temporary measure. Any registered dog that only has a temporary measure, must follow the above rule. If a newly registered dog is over 3, they must obtain a measure by an official UKI measurer by their 3rd trial and this measurement will be permanent.

UKI International Challenge Event (I.C.E.)



- Run under UKI rules and regulations.
- The aim of the I.C.E is to give UKI competitors an opportunity to run courses designed by some of the high profile judges who will be judging at the 3 main international events in 2026 of FCI AWC, European Open, or WAO.
- There are 2 levels: International I.C.E for dogs in the Champ level of the UKI international Program and Rookie I.C.E for dogs in the Beginner & Novice UKI International Program. Dogs may only run in one event.
- Senior UKI international level dogs may choose either International I.C.E. or Rookie I.C.E.. If a Senior dog is mistakenly entered into both events, the dog will be put into the International I.C.E. and a \$10 admin fee will be charged to the handlers account for deleting the other entry. Any refund charges will also apply if paid online.
- Freedom in course design and challenges is down to the designing judge and will not be changed by UKI.
- Designers will be requested to design the International I.C.E. at the level of the championship they are judging this year and the Rookie at the FCI A2 level. (Please note for Rookie, the A2 level is the middle level of 3 levels at FCI.)
- The international I.C.E level must run the Jumping class first, followed by the Agility.
- The Rookie level can begin with either class running first.
- There is a separate competition for each jump height at the event
- Both classes must be run by the same dog/handler partnership.
- The events consist of a Jumping class & an Agility class with scores combined.
- Least faults win with time used as a tiebreaker in all aspects of the event.
- In the event of an overall tie, the result of the Agility class will decide the Winner. If there is still a tie a run-off will be required on the last class run.
- Dogs must compete in the height they are running in the International Program at this trial where the I.C.E is being held.
- Winning International I.C.E. partnership gains an invite to the 1-TDC Invitational and bye into the 2nd round of the US & Canadian National Championships 2026.
- Winning Rookie I.C.E. partnership can choose to automatically move the dog to UKI Champion level in both International and Speedstakes programs. Plus, the team will gain a bye into the 2nd round of the US & Canadian National Championship. (Rookie does NOT gain an invite to the 1-TDC Invitational.)
- Classes will run in strict running order. Running orders will be randomly drawn for the first round of each class and will run in reverse order (seeded) for the second class.
- Running order conflicts to follow Masters Series Heat rules (refer to Masters Rules in the premium)
- Eliminations in the first round will still progress to the second round, with E's running random in the beginning of the RO for the second round.
- An elimination = 100 faults with a 60 second course time. An absent or NFC run = 1000 faults with a 60 second course time.
- A no show in either round will negate placing in the I.C.E including any awards or prizes.
- Clear rounds in either class will count towards the dog's International Program level progression.
- UKI reserves the right to rule at the event on anything not covered in these rules. Any amendments to these rules will be announced to competitors either in the confirmation information or general briefings.

BY ENTERING UKI EVENTS, COMPETITORS AGREE TO the following and the terms and conditions on the entry forms

UK Agility International Rules and Regulations apply to the whole event and all people and dogs must always comply with these. As a competitor, it is your responsibility to be aware of the rules and regulations as they stand at the time of the show. This show will run under the current edition UK Agility International rules found on the UKI web page. Each competitor acknowledges through their entry to the UKI event that their participation is a privilege and not a right.

Competitors through submission of entry acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of **UK Agility International Rules and Regulations** including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry:

Please ensure to read the **move up rules – section 2.0**. At a UKI trial where the dog is competing for more than one day and the dog completes the requirements for a level on a prior day; they must move up the following day.

All dogs and handlers must be registered with UK Agility International to compete. UK Agility International's official rules & regulations are available to view free from the UKI web page. If you or your dog is not already registered, please register online at www.ukagilityinternational.com.

All dogs are entered at this show at their owners' risk and whilst every care will be taken, the show management and UKI will not accept responsibility for loss, damage, or injury however caused to dogs, persons, or property while at the UKI event.

Dogs under 18 calendar months of age on the day of the Show are not eligible to compete in UKI Trials, with the exception of dogs over 15 calendar months of age eligible to compete in Nursery Classes & Speedstakes classes.

A dog shall be withdrawn from competition without refund if it is: suffering from any infectious or contagious disease, interfering with the safety of any person or other animal, or if it is likely to cause itself damage or its welfare is in danger if it continues competing.

It is expressly understood that competitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs, children, and guests. Any competitor whose dogs, children, or guests create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior, will at the discretion of the show management, be asked to remove the offending dogs, children, guests from the event grounds. Any competitor or competitor's dog that is dismissed from the show by the judge and or show manager in accordance with UKI rules and regulations will have no recourse to any refund of fees paid such as entry fees, camping fees, crating fees, and any other fees associated with the event.

It is the competitor's responsibility to be available for their class and running order. Handlers working more than one dog in a class **must ensure that the dogs compete in the sequence in which they are drawn**. Failure to do so will result in elimination.

Dogs left in hot cars, or dogs appearing to be in distress, will be dealt with as seen fit by the Show Management.

Should a judge be unable to fulfill the appointment to judge, the show management reserves the right to appoint another judge. Should circumstances so dictate the show manager, in consultation with the Judges, may alter arrangements as necessary. Such changes and the circumstances surrounding them must be reported to UK Agility International. In the event of abandonment of the show through circumstances beyond our control, the SHOW MANAGEMENT may defray such expenses from the entry fee to cover the cost of the show preparation. These accounts will then be made public.

Rules of Conduct:

UKI promotes dog agility pursuant to regulations consistent with international standards as a competitive, spectator sport. All competitors, officials, and event personnel shall conduct themselves in a professional and sportsmanlike manner consistent with the foregoing statement of purpose and seek to uphold, and enhance where possible, the image of the sport and UKI through such conduct and actions including on social media platforms.

By virtue of their entry, competitors acknowledge and agree to comply with all UKI Rules and Regulations and agree to accept any sanctions that are imposed for failure to comply. The judge has responsibility for determining when it is appropriate to excuse a dog and competitor from the ring. The show officials have responsibility for determining when an infraction should result in a verbal warning, written warning and/or expulsion of a competitor, dog, or any person from the event by conducting the procedure outlined in the UKI rule book. UKI head officials, through further investigation, may impose sanctions including suspension or expulsion from future events.

The following is a partial list of infractions on which the judge or trial officials will take action: Abuse of a dog on the grounds; actions that may have the appearance of abuse of a dog; willful misconduct or interference with a competitor's right to show; any acts of poor sportsmanship; violation of procedural rules; compulsive, correctional training on the grounds; willful misrepresentation on entry forms; willful misrepresentation of animals; dog aggression; failure to exercise diligence in the control of the behavior of their dog including a dog clearly not under the control of the handler; concerns for the welfare of a dog or who is unfit for competing; intimidation and/or impolite confrontation of judges, event officials, event helpers, or other competitors; creating excessive delays as a failure to respect the authority of event officials.

Social Media Conduct

Cyber bullying of any kind towards UKI, trial management & staff, competitors, judges, helpers or volunteers will not be tolerated. Examples of cyber bullying include but are not limited to, communications that seek to intimidate, manipulate, falsely discredit, put down, try to control, rudely confront, demand, and comments that try to incite further issues. Further, UKI is committed to maintaining an environment that is built on mutual respect and is free from racism, discrimination and harassment. In keeping with this goal, any behavior that is hateful towards race, color, religion, creed, national origin or ancestry, ethnicity, sex, and gender will not be tolerated. Any of these cases may sanction removal from all associated social media pages and even lead to expulsion of UKI events and even further expulsion of organization membership.

Refund and Entry Cancellation Policy

Entries will not be accepted, changed, or altered after the closing date or capping level has been reached except for the purpose of moving to a higher level. A full refund is available for any membership that is not older than 14 days from the date of account creation. A full refund is available before the closing date or capping level is met for any show. There will be no cost if refund money is to be left in your UKI account. If a refund is requested, a 5% administration fee for a credit card refund will be assessed, per transaction. ***After the closing date, a partial refund may be available for extraordinary circumstances, but this lies with the individual show management based on their own policies. Contact the show management for details, NOT UKI.***

Payment of Entry fees (for online entries)

Payment of entry fees and Instant Account Top up Fees must be made directly to the UKI member account or directly to the trial before a competitor may compete. PLEASE BE AWARE – at the closing date of entries, if you are paying by check, your account balance under “My Account” will show as \$0.00 USD. A note will confirm that you are paying the trial directly. This enables you to enter and pay for other trials online. If you have a \$0.00 USD zero balance display on your UKI Home page, it does not constitute a cancelled entry. Only you are responsible to cancel your entry online by going back into the show you entered and clicking CANCEL MY ENTIRE ENTRY. UKI will not cancel any entries. If in doubt, you must check your entries from the “My Entries” link, as well as reviewing your account transactions. If you have not cancelled your entry as above before the closing date, you are still responsible to pay the entry fee.

Additional administration charges may be imposed to a member's account due to negligence that result in administration time to correct. Possible infractions include, but are not limited to, submitting incorrect trial entry information, including incorrect handler and dog number, creating duplicate membership or dog accounts, and late payment fees. Charges are based on an hourly rate of \$20 per hour.

Media & Sponsor Rights Release

Through the entry into this event, all competitors grant to UKI and its affiliated companies, representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media known now or in the future. Further, I hereby release UKI and its affiliates, representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right. Sponsors of UKI events may email entrants with their product and or service information. If a competitor does not wish to receive emails from these sponsors, they must email the show management before the close of the trial entry date to declare this, ensuring they receive a receipt email that this information has been received by the trial management.

Masters Series Tournament Rules

The aim of Masters is to encourage more competitive running in UKI classes and improve the overall standard of top level agility. The Masters has been created for dogs and competitors whose goal is to compete at both National and International level.

General Rules

Open to all UKI level dogs including Select heights. Separate competition for each height. Agility and Jumping rounds with results combined. Handlers must run in strict running orders, failure to do so will result in elimination. Either Agility or Jumping classes may run first. If a handler has 2 dogs entered within a jump height, they may move their first dog up so that there are as many dogs as possible between their dogs. If this is not possible, they will receive a 6-minute break. If a handler has more than 2 dogs within a jump height and the entry is not large enough for a sufficient gap in between all their dogs, the first of their dogs drawn will be allowed to run in between a jump height change, if a jump height change is available before their height. If it is not, the final decision will be made by the judge and show manager, taking into consideration fairness to the competitor and other entrants in the Masters Class. Day of Entries must run first within the running orders of the first class. The second class must run in reverse order of placing from first class. The dog must run in the height that he will compete at in the Masters Final. The same dog and handler must run both rounds. Only the handler who qualifies the dog through a Masters Heat, may run the dog in the US Open Masters Final. Any extraordinary circumstances to be ruled by UKI.

Scoring

Standard UK Agility Marking will apply. Faults converted into seconds. 5 faults = 5 seconds. Time faults are treated the same as course faults. An elimination = 100 faults plus 60 second course time. An absent or NFC run = 1000 faults with a 60 second course time. Dogs with an absent or NFC run in either the Agility or Jumping will forfeit any Q's or awards gained in the other round; in other words, both rounds must be run for competition. Dogs with double elimination will not be placed. An E in the individual round will not be placed in that round. Dogs with the lowest score will be deemed the winner. In the event of a tie, the Agility result will be the deciding factor, followed by the jumping result. If a tie still remains, a runoff will be required. If there is a tie for the Individual class wins, a runoff will be required on that course to determine the winner and subsequent placings.

Final Qualification: 2 ways to qualify for the Final to be held at the UKI US Open:

A. Individual Winners (per height) of the Masters Agility or Masters Jumping class (even if an E is earned in the other round).	B. 1st & 2nd Overall (per height) (even if an E is earned in one of the rounds).

Prizes:

Of the Prize entry fee; \$5.00 is placed in the heat prize fund. Each height has its own prize fund and will be divided as per Masters "Prize Money Guide". Prize fund is for overall winners only. \$1 from each entry fee will be split & placed in the Final prize fund and Team USA WAO fund. In the event there is not a monetary winner within a height, the prize money will be sent to UKI to go towards the Final prize fund.
